ABRAHAM AND THE MITZVAH OF BIKKUR CHOLIM - SOTAH 12A

Rabbi Hama, son of Rabbi Hanina, says: Just as the Holy Blessed One, visits the sick, as it is written with regard to God's appearing to Abraham following his circumcision: "And the Lord appeared unto him by the terebinths of Mamre" (Genesis 18:1), so too, should you visit the sick.

BIKKUR CHOLIM AND PRAYER - SHULCHAN ARUCH 335:4 12A

According to the Rema [Rabbi Moses Isserles] "One who visited a sick person and did not not offer a prayer on their behalf, has not fulfilled the mitzvah of bikkur cholim, visiting the sick."

PRAYING AT BEDSIDE OF ONE WHO IS SICK— MAIMONIDES, MISHNEH TORAH, MOURNING, CHAPTER 14:6

When one comes to visit a sick person... one should wrap themselves in a *tallit*, sit below [the patient's] head, entreat God for mercy on their behalf and depart.

DEATH OF RABBI YEHUDA - BT KET. 104A

Rabbi Yehuda was frail, suffering and close death. As the end of his life drew near, his students continued to pray for their teacher to live. Upon seeing the pain and physical discomfort of her master, Rabbi Yehuda's handmaid, ascended to the roof of his house and threw a jar from the roof that shattered as it hit the ground. Startled by the noise, the students were momentarily distracted from their praying, at which time "the soul of Rabbi Yehuda departed to its eternal rest." (BT Ket. 104a)

Goses - Yoreh Deah, 339.1

One in a dying condition is considered a living being in all respects.

DEATHBED VISIONS - ZOHAR I, 218B; III, 88A, I 98A

On the deathbed the soul is granted an additional supernal spirit... and sees what she has never been worthy enough to see throughout her life.

No one leaves the world before seeing Shechinah... And with Shechinah there come three ministering angels to receive the soul of the righteous.

"Much of what occurs during [the "nearing death experience"] is beyond words..subtle and deeply inner: intuitions, recognitions, experiences of realms of being and understanding, realms of depth and light and truth that words cannot grasp." TRADITIONAL UNDERSTANDING OF VIDUI, YOREH DEAH 338.1

If one feels death approaching, they are instructed, 'Confess [your sins]!' And the person is told, 'Many confessed [their sins] and died not, and many who have not confessed, died; and as a reward, should you confess, you will live; and one who confesses [sins] has a portion in the world to come.' And if the person is unable to make confession with the mouth, they should confess in the heart. If they do not know what to confess, instruct the person to say, 'My death should be an expiation for all my sins.'
