An exploration of little-known teachings on the afterlife journey of the soul in both traditional and mystical Judaism. As travelers through time, we shall explore texts of of Torah, Talmud, Midrash, Zohar and Hasidic tales investigating diverse ways Judaism has understood the mystery of death and the world beyond.

OCTOBER 10 7:30-9:00 PM

1) AFTERLIFE IN BIBLICAL AND RABBINIC TRADITION: SHEOL AND OLAM HABA This introductory session shall explore texts of Torah to find often-ignored teachings on life after death. And in Talmud and Midrash we shall study varied images Olam Haba - the world to come - the Angel of Death, resurrection and more..

2) AFTERLIFE IN KABBALISTIC TRADITION: POST-MORTEM JOURNEY OF THE SOUL Medieval Kabbalah and later Hasidism developed very extensive teachings on afterlife and we shall look at the journey of the soul in Zohar and Hasidic stories.

3) AFTERLIFE & CONTEMPORARY DEATH RITUALS: SPIRITUAL WISDOM FOR TODAY If we start with the assumption that consciousness survives bodily death, how does that affect the way we think about the traditional death rituals of funeral, shiva, Kaddish, etc. We shall look at practical applications of Jewish afterlife teachings.

4) HALLOWE'EN SPECIAL — PROPHET SAMUEL, KING SAUL AND THE WITCH OF ENDOR: SPIRITUALISM & POST-MORTEN COMMUNICATION IN JEWISH TRADITION

We shall end our series by looking at little-known Jewish texts on direct communication with spirits in the world beyond.
